We ship from August thru October. Try not to request a date when your temperatures will be above 90°F but at least a month before your first frost. We ship at the first of the week so that your order will be ready for you to plant on the weekend. Plants are shipped bare root.

Every effort is made to ship healthy true to name stock. Complaints about conditions of stock must be sent to us immediately after package is received. We cannot be responsible for loss over the winter or your growing practices. Plants may not bloom the first year after transplanting.

**2012 Iris ensata Introduction**

**Amethyst's Sister \$35.00**

Sister of Amethyst's Actress (Harris'09) may not act, however she knows how to hold center stage. A full round 9 falls mid to large sized flower. The rich non fading blends of mid to dark amethyst give way to blue violet halos surrounding the light yellow signals. She can grow to be a tall 52 inches, 1 to 2 branches, holding 3 to 6 buds per stem.



**2012 Iris ensata Introduction**

**Dragon Tapestry \$ 35.00**

Selected not only for the roundness of the flower form, also for the evenness of the broken color pattern. Dark wine red splashed on white, no two flowers are alike. Growing to 36" tall with 1 to 2 branches. Can throw up to 5 buds per stem with very good bloom sequence.



**2012 Iris laevigata Introduction**

**Lakeside Ghost \$25.00**

The contrast of the smoky red-violet styles and heart of the flower to the lighter pale blue of the falls caught our eye. Lighter falls speckled with blue can be smoky pale blue to white depending on how strong the spring sun is. Can grow to 37 inches tall. The 1 to 2 branches typically carry 3 to 5 buds to a stem with very good bloom sequence.

# BEARDED IRIS

Over the years I have been selecting for show quality cut blooms and plants that are more disease resistant in the Columbia River Gorge.

Culture: Full sun, good air circulation, moderately fertile soil, good drainage, lifting and dividing every three years will give you strong plants with show stems and bloom.

Deciduous and summer drought tolerant.

**S** – Standards, the top half of the flower

**F** – Falls, the bottom half of the flower

**B** – Beard, the fuzzy appendage on the fall

## STANDARD DWARF BEARDED (SDB)

All \$ 4.00 each

Growing into a tight mound with many blooms 8 to 16 inches tall this iris is considered by many to be the perfect rockery iris. These need a good winter chill to bloom properly. Peak bloom for us is mid to late April. Zone 3-8 (9?)

Graceful flowers on a grass-like foliage plant. These are hybrids from species native to central Europe; they are very strong, hardy and adaptable in the perennial bed. Tetraploid (tet.) plants generally have stockier looking flowers, foliage and stems than diploids (dip.). Peak bloom for us is late May along with the Tall bearded iris. Zone 3 – 8 (9?)

<b>Dear Currier</b>	(Dunlop '05) Tet. 30", Ruffled dark grey blue with violet wash, upright styles are much lighter and showy
<b>Dear Dianne</b>	(McEwen '79) Tet. 27", Medium blue violet with distinct silver edge, very late season
<b>Fresh Notes</b>	(Schafer/Sacks '04) Dip. 20", F; Bright blue with lighter styles and standards, crisp gold signal
<b>Great Falls Love</b>	(Cole '07) Tet. 32", S; ruffled deep violet, F; ruffled darker violet with blue undertones, Note: large 4 inch flowers
<b>Joyce Cole</b>	(Cole '06) Tet. 30", Very ruffled creamy white with a smooth gold throat, blooms late in season
<b>Kiss The Girl</b>	(Schafer/Sacks '04) Dip. 28", S; butter yellow, F; bright daffodil yellow, Note: strong grower for a yellow siberian
<b>Pansy Purple</b>	(McEwen '71) Dip. 32", A delicate looking flower of pansy purple in color, a garden favorite
<b>Reprise</b>	(Warburton '87) Dip. 32", Medium Blue with red violet tones that sets a second bloom 2-3 weeks after the first if grown well.
<b>Roaring Jelly</b>	(Schaefer-Sacks '92) Dip. 36", Red violet with lighter standards and styles, Gold signal
<b>Ships Are Sailing</b>	(Schafer/Sacks '98) Dip. 35", Wide, light ruffled flowers are shades of medium blue, tall and stately
<b>Shirley's Choice</b>	(McEwen '87) Tet. 32", Large 4" white flowers. Foliage holds long into fall
<b>Snow Prince</b>	(Tiffney '90) Dip. 34", Ivory falls have a blue thumbprint netted markings of butterscotch. White styles and standards top the small delicate looking flower. Very floriferous with a long bloom season.
<b>Somebody Loves Me</b>	(Hollingworth '98) Tet. 32", Ruffled medium blue, large white blaze
<b>Summer Sky</b>	(Cleveland '35) Dip. 24", Pale blue with white styles. Small and delicate looking, also very vigorous and floriferous.
<b>Teal Velvet</b>	(McEwen '81) Tet. 32", Dark velvety royal purple, stately clumps.
<b>Three Hand Star</b>	(Schafer/Sacks '01) Dip. 29", S; medium blue, F; dark blue violet, wide overlapping petals.

### SPECIES AND SPECIES-X

- Iris douglasiana** \$6.00 Native from Coos Bay, Oregon to Northern California. Many pale amethyst flowers 3 inches across are held on 2 foot branching stems. Evergreen foliage 18 to 20 inches is dark green on one side and silver-green on the other. Plant blooms in May; it needs part to full sun and is very tolerant of varying soil conditions. Not recommended for areas outside the Pacific Northwest maritime zone 7-8.
- Iris graminea** \$6.00 Native to central and Southern Europe. Thin graceful fountain foliage 18 to 24 inches tall is deciduous. Small thumb size bright purple and white blooms are found hidden deep in the foliage late May. Cut some blooms and bring indoors to enjoy the wonderful scent of ripe plums. Needs full sun and summer drought.
- Iris innominata** \$6.00 Native to Southwest Oregon and Northwest California. Bright old gold flowers in May are heavily veined a reddish brown-purple. Foliage is 14 inches and evergreen, sun, spring rain, and good drainage. Not recommended for area outside the Pacific Northwest maritime zone 7-8.
- Iris japonica** \$6.00 Native to Asia, Many (20 plus) small pale blue-lavender blooms, opening a few at a time, on a multi-branched stalk 18 to 24 inches. Needs afternoon shade and a loose humus rich soil where it will become a ground cover. Evergreen foliage shows freeze damage at 28 F, blooms early spring.
- Iris pallida 'Argentea'** (Goos and Koenemann '1906) \$5.00 A small tall bearded iris with sweetly fragrant blue violet flowers. Grown for its white and green variegated foliage. *Iris pallida* is native to northeast Italy, Slovenia, grow as you would modern bearded irises, very hardy. See bearded iris culture and care.
- Iris pallida 'Variegata'** (Krelage and sons Barr '1901) \$5.00 A small tall bearded iris with sweetly fragrant blue violet flowers. Grown for its gold and green variegated foliage. *Iris pallida* is native to northeast Italy, Slovenia, grow as you would modern breaded irises, very hardy. See bearded iris culture and care.

- Iris tectorum** \$6.00 18 to 24 inches tall. Native to Asia. This woodland plant is happiest in a high filtered shaded area with a loose soil rich in humus. The large 4" violet flowers are heavily freckled darker. A great addition for the hosta and fern bed.
- Iris unguicularis** \$6.00 Native to the Mediterranean. The 18 to 20 inch medium green leaves are evergreen. Lightly fragrant 4 inch blue violet flowers sporadically bloom throughout the late winter months. Needs good drainage, sun and summer drought.
- SPEC-X 'Ally Oops'** (Borglum '02) \$6.00 36" A presumed cross between a Siberian and Iris pseudacorus. This plant has the robust ease of growing like pseudacorus but minus the seed pods, no dead-heading. The large showy May blooms are cream, heavily veined bright blue violet with light blue standards. Full sun to lightly filtered with loose rich moist soil, deciduous, very vigorous and hardy. Chartreuse early spring foliage turns green by bloom time.
- SPEC-X 'Child Of Roy'** (Borglum '05) \$6.00 24" The early spring chartreuse foliage (that greens up later in the season) makes a great contrasting back ground for the 3" white heavily netted purple blooms. The bright gold signal is veined black, striking. Full sun to lightly filtered with loose rich moist soil. Not invasive with seeds, no dead heading required.
- SPEC-X 'Gubijin'** (Shimizu) \$6.00 36 to 52" It will present with many two inch gold blooms and great strong upright foliage. Plant in full sun, with loose moist soil rich in organics. Not invasive with seed.
- SPEC-X 'Holden's Child'** (Tiffney '88) \$6.00 36" Second generation away from a wide cross involving Iris pseudacorus and an unknown gives a robust plant that is not invasive with seed. The dark red violet falls are topped with soft amethyst violet standards. Full sun with a loose rich moist soil, deciduous, very vigorous and hardy. - SPEC-X 'Roy Davidson'** (Hager '87) \$6.00 36 to 42 inches tall with many 3-inch bright gold flowers in May. Roy Davidson is much like one of its grandparents Iris pseudacorus. It can be grown in the water or a moist garden setting. But unlike I. pseudacorus, Roy Davidson is not invasive with seed, very hardy.

## JAPANESE IRIS

Iris ensata have been selectively bred from wild forms found in northern Asia. Their cultural needs are very demanding, if met they will reward you with a magnificent display of color approximately 2 to 3 weeks after Tall Bearded, Iris leavigata bloom. Peak bloom in our garden is the last two weeks of June.

### DESCRIPTION

Height, number of branches, and buds, were taken when the plants were three years old, and grown to my best ability. *Culture has a great influence*; please refer to the cultural sheet.

- F = FALLS** Number of petals - 3F single, 6F double, 9-12F, peony form
- S = STANDARDS** The 3 smaller petals of a 3F flower.
- STYLES** The 3 female parts of the flower. Some flowers have multiples that can be the most striking part of the flower.
- CREST** The flared end of the styles. Can be very large and showy.
- VEINS** A color pattern when the veins are darker than the base color of the petals.
- RAYS** A color pattern when the veins are lighter than the base color of the petals.
- SIGNAL** The bright colored spear on all falls. Can range from saffron to bright gold.
- HALO** The area around the Signal. Only some irises have a halo, it can be very note worthy.
